IMPORTANT REMINDERS

JUST A REMINDER FROM THE STUDENTS HANDBOOK REGARDING LOCKERS



Lockers are issued to students for their use. **The lockers, however, remain the property of the school and school officials have the authority to inspect lockers and their contents.** A locker is to be maintained in the condition issued. Damage to lockers will be billed to the occupants.

Locker combinations are given only to those students assigned to the locker. To maintain the security of your locker please comply with the regulations listed below. The school is not responsible for stolen items.

1. **Keep the combination secret; refrain from sharing it with others.**
2. **Use only the assigned locker; do not move to other lockers and do not allow others to use the locker.**
3. **Do not pre-set the combination.**
4. **Always close the locker securely.**
5. **Always spin the combination dial when leaving.**
6. **Report any malfunctions to the office immediately.**
7. **Refrain from placing items of great value in the locker; including purses, radios, calculators, jewelry, etc.**
8. **Lockers are to be kept clean. Food, beverage, and food/beverage containers may not be stored overnight.**
9. **Do not hit, kick, strike, etc. the lockers. Damages will be billed to the occupant.**

Requests for locker changes are rarely granted. The student's role in maintaining the security of his/her locker is extremely important. The student's cooperation is appreciated.

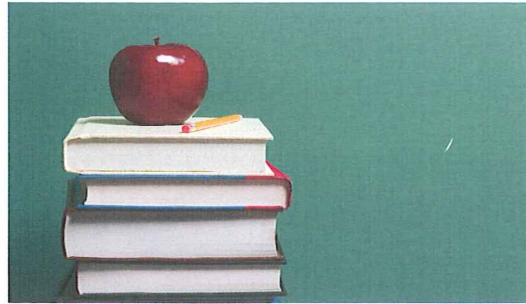

Please complete the following prior to attending on February 8th:

1. 2011 Income Taxes
2. Complete all areas of FAFSA that you can.

REMEMBER: Everyone should complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid website www.FAFSA.ed.gov). This is the one form that applies for all state and federal student aid including grants, loans and work study. (To apply for all college money available from the state or federal government you must complete this form). Even if you feel that you won't be eligible you should complete this form, some colleges use the information from this form for other purposes (work study, campus work, and local college money).

- Your 2011 untaxed income records-Social Security, Temporary Assistance to Needy Families, welfare, or veteran benefits records (if any)
- Your 2011 bank statements
- Your 2010 business and investment mortgage information, business and farm records, stock, bond, and other investment records
- You alien registration card (if you are not a U.S. Citizen)

For all St. Clair County high school students

The ACT is about creating opportunities. By increasing scores, students increase the likelihood of receiving scholarships and opening doors during the college admission process. In some instances, two points on the composite score could result in thousands of dollars in scholarship money. A higher score can also mean acceptance to your “dream” school. Participating in additional ACT preparation will help students increase their scores.

This ACT test prep series is sponsored by the St. Clair County KnowHow2GO initiative. One of the main goals of KnowHow2GO is to increase the number of students in St. Clair County who continue their education beyond high school. Addressing this goal, St. Clair County RESA will provide a comprehensive ACT prep four-week series taught by motivated, hands-on instructors using online course and print content in mathematics, English, science and reading.

These are economically priced workshops at just \$25 each. Students may register for one subject per day. There is a limit of 24 students per session. **48 hour notice of cancellation is required or the full registration fee will be charged. All sessions are held at the M-TEC building on the SC4 campus, 323 Erie Street, Port Huron.**
